



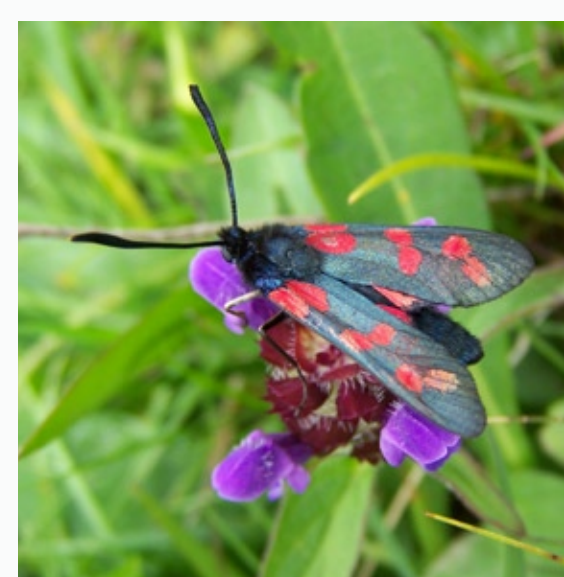
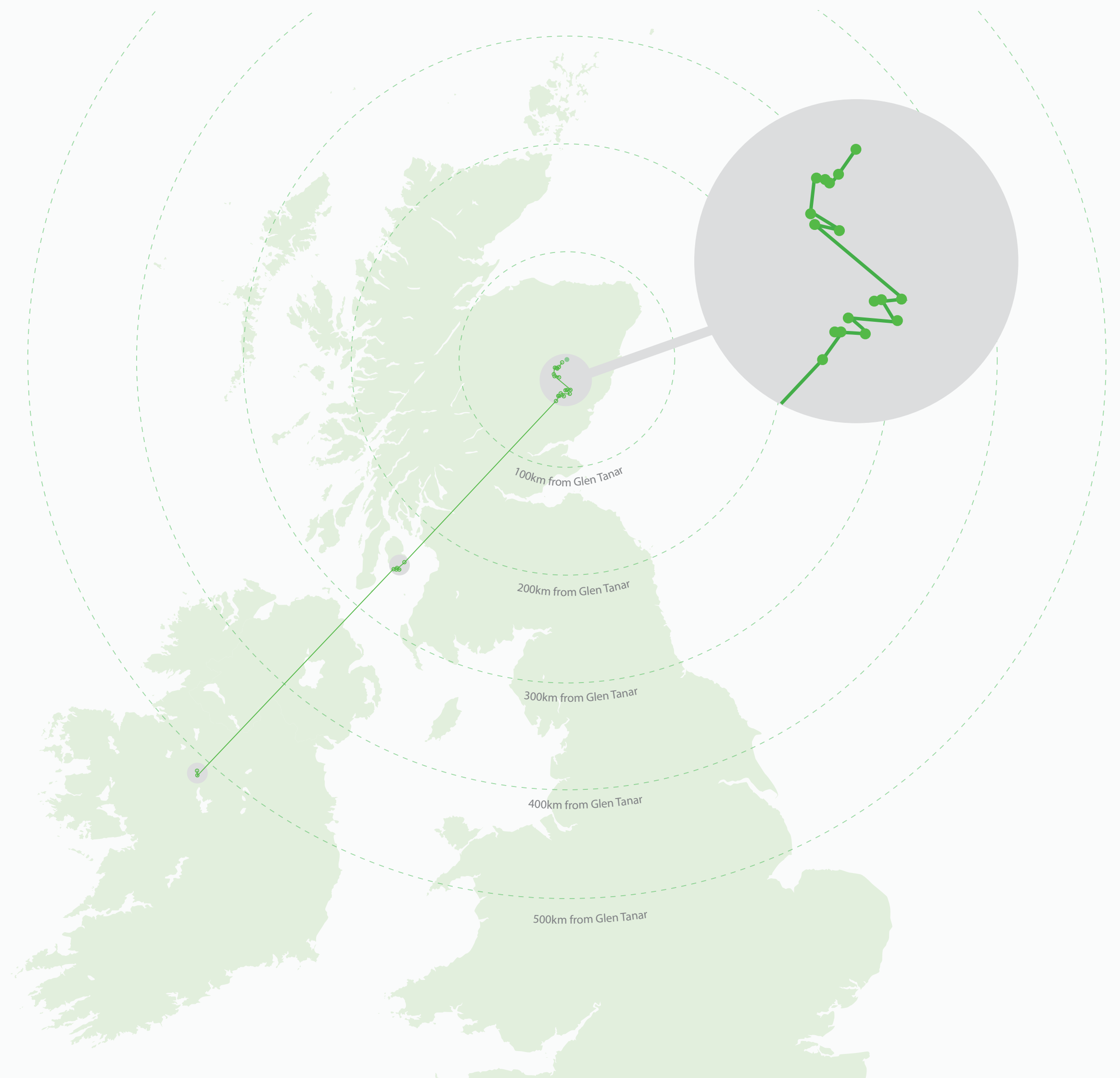
Birds of prey from the estate can go a long way. Two hen harrier chicks were fitted with tiny radio transmitters in June 2010 and given the names Glen and Tanar. This one's Tanar, a female. Since then she seems to have settled down around Loch Ryan, near Stranraer. Glen has been as far as Ireland and was last tracked on the Isle of Arran, west of Glasgow.

This golden eagle is feeding on a deer carcass, left out on the moor by the estate's wildlife management team. In the past, gamekeepers used to trap or shoot birds of prey to keep them from taking the grouse. At Glen Tanar wildlife managers are pioneering new ways to live and work with birds of prey so the estate can balance conservation goals with traditional field sports. Giving the birds food like this is just one of the techniques used.
